
Apostrophe





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Main Uses of Apostrophes:

1. To form a contraction;

don't can't wouldn't

2. To show possession

John s car

the boy's bike



Contraction

In a contraction, two words are combined into one shorter form.


takes the place of the missing letter or letters

you + you're are attunga School you're

The apostrophe almost always marks where a letter or letters have been taken out to form the new word.



Example :-





Common Contractions

aren't = are not

can't = can not

didn't = did not

he's = he is

I'd = I would, I had

it's = it is

let's = let us

she'll = she will

we've = we have

would've = would have

you're = you are

Won't = will not



Possession

- •Possessives are words used to show ownership or belonging. Like contractions, they're also formed with the apostrophe.
- Example: Dr. Perera's laptop
 - the laptop belongs to Dr. Perera
 - Dr. Perera owns the laptop.



Notice that the apostrophe in possessive words does NOT stand for an omitted letter like it does in contractions.

contraction:

don't (missing ©)

possessive:

dog's tail (no missing letter, the tail belongs to the dog)



Rules for adding an apostrophe to form a possessive

1. If a word ends in –s already, add only the apostrophe:


The students bags were stolen from the classroom during the interval.

If the word does not end in -s, add 's:



- Boy's School
- Dog's legs

- Boys' school
- Dogs' legs







Some words are possessive without the apostrophe. These words are the **possessive pronouns**:

Tip:

Be careful not to confuse *it's* and *its*.

it's = it is

my, mine
his
her, hers
your, yours
our, ours
their, theirs
whose

Using the apostrophe

We use an apostrophe to;

1) • Show the omission of a letter (contraction) - positive

I am – I'm Who is – Who's

You are - You're Here is - Here's

He is – He's Let us- Let's

She is – She's That is – That's

It is – It's There is – There's

We are – We're They're

• Show the omission of a letter (contraction) - negative + question

Are not - Aren't

Is not - Isn't

Do not - Don't

Should not - Shouldn't

· Show the omission of letters (contraction) - positive

I have - I've

I will - I'll

I would I'd

• Show the omission of letters (contraction) - negative + question

Will not - Won't

Cannot - Can't

2) • Show possession/ownership

e.g. :- Rahal's bat

Abdul's book

Ann's pencil

Yoga's bicycle

· We don't use the apostrophe with the following possessive pronoun-
